



## Beginning Landscape Zoom Class Description

Learn the basic techniques for creating a beautiful landscape. In this class you will learn about fabric choices, perspective, using hues correctly and stitching elements such as trees, grasses, flowers.

These basics will give you a great foundation for making another landscape (or two or ten!) on your own. The kit will supply fabrics that will all work beautifully and you will get to choose which ones you want to use, and how to lay them out. Realism is always my goal, and you'll be so pleased with how easy it is to achieve. See attached photo.

## Beginning Landscapes Class Supply List and Kit Materials

In this class you will be making a simple landscape with stitched features such as trees, flowers, and grasses. It will be a picture suitable for framing within an 8x10" mat and frame. You must be able to use your machine in free motion mode with a darning or free motion foot, and do a normal straight stitch.

**Kit:** \$28 includes fabrics, stabilizer, fusible – mailed to your home address on your registration form

### **Supplies to be provided by the student:**

**General sewing supplies** and an iron and non-stick pressing cloth

**Machine:** The machine must be capable of dropping the feed dogs and using a free motion or darning foot, in straight and zig zag stitches. Microtex or Universal needles, 90/14 or 80/12, are ideal. If you haven't done this before, please practice free motion stitching just to make sure that your machine is set up for it.

**Glue Sticks:** inexpensive ones work well for temporary fabric basting, don't use purple (sometimes the purple doesn't disappear). Optional: cardboard scrap to avoid getting glue on your table.

**Threads:** medium (40 or 50) weight top threads that are not shiny, or varigated:  
at least 6 values of greens

at least 3 values of browns

two values of the color for your flowers (i.e. dark orange and light orange)

Optional: bobbin thread in white (70 or 80 wt)

**Scratch paper and pencil**

**Optional:** a picture mat with an opening about 8" x 10" You can easily make one by cutting an 8x10" hole in a larger piece of paper.

**REGISTRATION:**
